

## **PE and Sports Grant**

The government is providing additional funding of £150 million per annum for academic years 2013 to 2014 and 2014 to 2015 to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding - provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport - has been allocated to primary school head teachers.

This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools.

### **Purpose of funding**

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but schools have been given the freedom to choose how they do this. A list of possible uses has been suggested.

Layston First School has decided to use the money to:

- Allocate a PE coordinator role, from within our existing staff, to work alongside sports coaches and teachers to strengthen teaching and learning in this subject across school, gather evidence of performance, liaise with the NE Herts Sports Partnership, organise interschool fixtures and festivals, run sports clubs.
- support and engage the least active children in physical activities through running a Change for Life Club
- pay for professional development opportunities for teachers in PE and sport through our link to the Sports Partnership and from in school CPD through teachers working alongside sports coaches during our sports afternoons and swimming sessions
- increase pupils' participation in the sports and physical activities through promotion of after school clubs in sport and liaison with sport clubs in Buntingford and the local area.
- improve resources to support the development of the subject
- buy into membership of the NE Herts Sports Partnership which supports planning delivery of and participation in high quality sport for all, offers a varied programme of events competitions and festivals to include all young people and supports liaison between school and community sports groups.

The impact of the use of the grant will be reviewed at the end of the first year.
