## Year 1

We have had a very busy start to the school year. Year 1 have settled in really well and it has been a pleasure getting to know them all. It has been lovely to see all the children engaged in their learning. Here are some of the things we have been up to:

In Maths we have been looking at place value. We began the year by counting from any given number being exposed to mathematical terminology. Year 1 have been learning their number bonds to 10 being encouraged to write number sentences from looking at part-whole models. Year 1 have enjoyed using cubes and Cuisenaire rods to support their understanding.



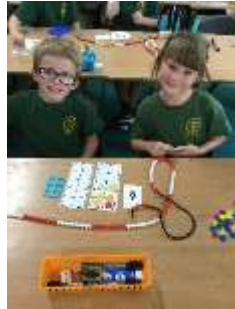
In English our focus book has been *Oi Get Off Our Train!* Year 1 have been recalling the story, writing captions and lists. We have also been focussing on *Man on the Moon*, using our acting skills as well as writing our own stories. Year 1 enjoyed following instructions when making their moon rock cakes!



In PE we had an exciting opportunity to join Darcey Bussell and her team live. Dancing a variety of contemporary movements. We have also been developing our balancing and co-ordination skills.

## Year 2

It has been a great start to Year 2 and it has been lovely to see the children engaged in their learning. Here are some of the things we have been up to:



In Maths we have been looking at place value. We began the year by exploring how we could represent numbers in different ways. We then moved on to looking at the number of tens and ones in a number as well as ordering numbers.



In Computing we have been looking at algorithms. We created our own algorithms to see if we could get the Bee-Bot to the moon!



During our English lessons we have been exploring fairy tales. We acted out Jack and the Beanstalk and then wrote our own version of this story.

## Year 3

Year 3 have settled in very well to their new classroom and we have really enjoyed getting to know them!

We have been doing lots of practical activities in Maths!



We also tested out our team work skills by building the highest tower we possibly could using spaghetti and marshmallows!

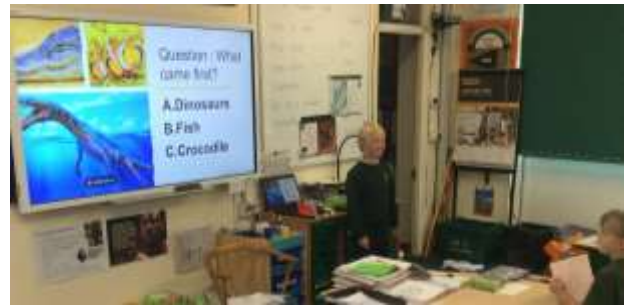


Finally, we have been learning all about forces in Science and tested out different surfaces by seeing how much friction they had.

In science, we've started learning about electricity. The children really enjoyed building and testing circuits.
