Year 4 Summer Learning

In maths, we will be finishing up multiplication & division before moving on to length & perimeter and then fractions.

In history, we will be learning about Ancient Egypt. Learning about mummification is always good fun.



In science, we will be learning about the digestive system, teeth and food chains.

In D&T, we'll be doing some cooking lessons and designing and making night lights and cereal boxes!

Forest School

Music

We will be doing a few cooking sessions this term!

<u>PE</u>

We have PE every **Wednesday** <u>and</u> **Thursday** so please send your children into school in their PE kits on those days. Depending on the weather, this should include:

- Jumper
- Shorts or jogging bottoms

No earrings on PE days please!

- A jacket for cold/wet weather

Spelling tests take place on **Thursdays**, with new spellings handed out afterwards. Completed spelling sheets should be <u>returned to school on</u> Thursdays.

Homework tasks can be found on the Year 4 class page on the school website. Please ask if you would like a printed copy.

Children are expected to know <u>ALL</u> the **times tables** (and division facts) by the end of the year. We will continue having weekly tests on **Wednesdays**. Please practice at home for these.

In June, Year 4 will complete the online "multiplication tables check". Click here for further information. It takes just 5 minutes, but children only get 6 seconds to answer each question, so they need to know their times tables really well!

Reading at Home Plea...

Regular reading at home remains extremely important (including more confident readers). Research from all over the world shows that **children that read widely and often do better at school than children that don't**. Reading is the single most important factor in determining a child's future (economic, employment and well-being).

If you want to help your child at home, reading is the best thing you can do.

Ideally, every child should read with an adult every day (little and often is best so ten to fifteen minutes a day).
