


# Reading – Why It's So Important

- Reading for pleasure is the **single most important factor** in determining a child's future (economic, employment, mental health).
- \*Children from impoverished backgrounds who were highly engaged in reading obtained significantly higher reading scores than those with 'higher status' but low engagement with reading.
- Lack of engagement with reading correlates to lack of employment, lower wages and low well-being.
- Big impact on writing, spelling and spoken language too

# Times Tables

- Times Tables Rock Stars can be used to practise

# Multiplication Tables Check (MTC)

- In June 2024, Year 4 will complete the online “multiplication tables check”.
- Takes just 5 minutes
- 25 multiplication questions
- Children only get 6 seconds to answer each question, so they need to know their times tables really well!

# Spelling

- Test every Friday
- First lot sent home this week (15<sup>th</sup> Sept)
- Accompanied by a maths frenzy and times tables grid (can be completed with or without being timed)
- **Children are expected to spell 'most' of the Y3/4 list by the end of Year 4**
- For some children, high frequency words will be prioritised instead
