

Year 2 Homework

In Maths this term we have spent 2 weeks learning about money.

I have taught the following:

- 1) Naming all coins and notes
- 2) Understanding the value of each coin and note
(20p = 20 pennies) (£1 = 100p) (£5 = 500p)
- 3) Adding pence together
(20p+10p)
- 4) Adding pounds together
(£4+£2)
- 5) Combining pounds and pence
(£3 and 10p) - *We have not introduced the decimal place. We write 'and' instead.*
- 6) Comparing amounts using > < =
(90p > 30p)
- 7) Calculating simple change
(50p - 30p) *using our base 10 knowledge*



Home learning activities:

Spend some time at home exploring coins and notes you have available - these could be from a piggy bank, a wallet/purse or toy money.

- 1) Sort the coins and notes into groups
- 2) Count the coins and notes in each group and work out the total value of each group (the children have been learning to count in 2's, 5's and 10's to support this but may need help to count accurately beyond 20)

Shopping time!

On a piece of A4 create a shop with objects to buy for whole amounts (5p, 50p, 20p, £1, £10). In class we will spend time role-playing being shop keepers and customers buying and selling goods from everyone's shop. We will see how much each shop made at the end of the session.
