

Dressing up

This year for World Book Day we are inviting the children and staff to dress up as a word! This year we will be focussing on building the children's vocabulary and how this can help us as readers to fuel our imagination when visualising characters and settings.

We encourage you to be adventurous with your vocabulary choices - their word could even describe their favourite book characters: courageous; mischievous; bright; sluggish; enthralling; intriguing. If your child would still like to come dressed as a character, then this is great but encourage them to think of a word to describe the character e.g. Harry Potter: magical, Matilda: clever etc. Use a thesaurus to stretch your child's vocabulary choice.



Please do not spend lots of money on buying a costume! Use what you have at home already. You could come dressed in all black and your word could be *gloomy*, you could come dressed in pyjamas and your word could be *cosy*. Have fun with it!

Reception

Reception have had a busy half term. Firstly we would like to thank Kerry Dedman for making a fabulous water wall to enhance our water area and the new reading nook, which will be moved to our back garden.

We have been to space this half term, using props to act out going to space, linked to our core text. We also looked at the first moon landing by Neil Armstrong and compared to the images and videos when Tim Peake went to space.

We also learnt how the astronauts got their food and tasted some astronaut food. We used our senses to small, taste and see what it looked like, with different reviews!



We also learnt from Tim Peake how the astronauts go to the toilet in space.



We are working hard at being brave writers and use our phonics to write simple CVC words and captions, linked to our stories and our morning jobs and during our independent learning time.

We have looked at where the continent of Asia is on the globe and google Earth and listened to the story of Lunar New Year. We learnt that some of us were born in the year of the dog and the year of the pig. This year is the year of the dragon. We compared this celebration with celebrations that we have. We had a taste of lots of Chinese food and then made a pictogram of what we liked best and least.

All the food disappeared very quickly!











We have had a busy half term in year 1 and it has been lovely to see all the children engaged in their learning.

In Maths, the children have enjoyed carrying out practical activities when learning about addition and subtraction within 20. It has been lovely to see all the children explain their answers in more detail, using their sentence stems to support their learning.

In English, they have enjoyed role-playing, hot seating, planning and writing their own versions on our focus fairy tales. (Cinderella, The Three Little Pigs and Little Red and the Very Hungry lion).

In Art, the children have been engrossed when exploring the work of Frida Kahlo. The children have been working very hard on their primary and secondary colours, using different types of brushes to make different types of lines when painting. They have also been amazing especially when recalling facts.

To finish of the term, Y1 have really enjoyed learning about Chinese New Year, taking part in lots of fun art and craft activities. They even had the opportunity to try different Chinese foods. We have also been learning about how Shrove Tuesday is celebrated in the UK, decorating and eating pancakes as well as taking part in a pancake flipping contest.











Maths

In Maths we have been learning how to multiply and divide numbers. We have worked practically with counters to calculate our answers. We have learnt to use arrays for multiplication and sharing circles for division. We have been so impressed with how the children have embraced this new learning!





History

We have been learning about three of the most famous queens that each ruled this country for a very long time.

Queen Elizabeth I, Queen Victoria and Queen Elizabeth II.


We have studied each time period and looked at the changes that happened during

In Science we have thoroughly enjoyed exploring and examining various rocks and fossils. The children found the unit very interesting and we had a lot of excellent scientific discussions.




We've crammed a lot into the last six weeks! In maths, we finished our unit on addition and subtraction with an active revision session in the hall. The children enjoyed finding the area of classroom objects using paper squares, and we used resources to help make sense of division.







In English, we've been writing playscripts and persuasive speeches. This week, the children shared their favourite speech with the class. In science, we finished our unit on electricity by making and testing handmade switches.







In art, the children created their own versions of Claude Monet's water lily pond. In D&T, we got our night lights under way (I think they will need all of half term to dry!)
