Reception

Reception have had a busy half term. They have been working so hard. With many thanks to Mikey's parents for making our new mud kitchen - pictures to follow.

We have been learning about our local area and walked around the town to look at human features and physical features of our environment.





We also had a wedding with Reverend Kirsty and the children were very good at acting out the wedding. The bride and groom looked beautiful!





This week we have been learning about the Easter Story and how Jesus died on the cross. We made our Easter gardens to show the symbolism of the cross. We made Easter Nests and had an egg hunt!





We have also cooked and enjoyed Gingerbread men and built bridges for the Billy Goats Gruff.

We have had a busy term in year 1 and it has been lovely to see all the children engaged in their learning.

In Maths, Year 1 have shown a great interest when learning about lengths and heights, as well as learning about Mass and Volume. Year 1 have enjoyed using Cubes, Cuisenaire rods, Scales and different shaped containers to support their understanding.







In English, Year 1 have been working really hard on their report writing. The children have also been planning and writing their own senses rhyming couplet poem.





In RE, the children are learning about different Easter symbols as well sequencing and recalling the Easter Story. They especially enjoyed eating some scrummy Hot cross buns!

In Art this half term we have created our own Islamic Tiles. We have learnt about geometric patterns and how to create them. We used a geoboard (on the chrome books) to create Islamic patterns and then used squared paper to create geometric designs. We then painted our geometric design on a tile. We have created some beautiful tiles!







In **Science** our focus has been on 'Living things and their habitats'. We have learnt about what <u>all living things</u> need to do to stay alive.





We also went on a mini-beast hunt and looked at microhabitats. We created pictograms of the data we collected.

In **PSHE** we have studied Fairtrade and how important it is to recognise fairness within the farming community. We have also looked at keeping ourselves safe by discussing the difference between a secret and a surprise. We use role-play a lot in PSHE to help us understand what to do in a variety of scenarios.

We have had a lovely half term in Year 3, the children have worked extremely hard and that has been shown across all areas of the curriculum.

In English we have written our own Fables, with our focus text being War and Peas by Michael Foreman! The children thoroughly enjoyed using their own creative ideas to help them write a story based on a chosen moral. We then shared our final stories with some of the Reception children!



In Maths we have explored length and perimeter, more recently moving on to fractions. The children have showed resilience and determination in Maths across this half term. This has been evident in the quizzes we have done to assess learning.

In History we have explored the Roman topic. The children have had various opportunities to complete lots of practical activities in this topic, including our Roman workshop day which was thoroughly enjoyed by all!



As you know, we shared Ofsted's report on the school and our response to it just before half term. I wanted to take this opportunity to share an update.

Firstly, can I say thank you to all of you who shared your reactions with the school. The overwhelming majority of these were supportive and suggested that your own experiences of the school do not match Ofsted's judgement. This has been very heartening for staff as they work hard on the areas for improvement that were identified.

Secondly, it has been great to see the staff team and the whole school community working together to take the school forward. This has been especially noticeable with the changes we have been making to the learning environment to support the learning of our Reception class. We are very grateful to all those who have helped build our new infrastructure.

At the governors' meeting last week we discussed progress on the Rapid Action Plan which we put in place to address the areas highlighted by Ofsted. I am pleased to say that we saw good progress in all areas. The impact of this is reflected in the latest teacher assessments of where children have reached in their learning and in the regular external reviews that we commission.

Most importantly all of this has been achieved without impacting on the wonderful positive atmosphere in our school, which was reflected in the children's participation in our Easter service at St Peter's church this week.


I'm sure you will want to join me in thanking all the staff for their hard work and hoping they enjoy a well-earned break over Easter.




Pennies in a Bottle Competition
