Attendance:

We continue to prioritise attendance and are delighted to celebrate all the children who have achieved 96% attendance and above over the Summer Term (up to 17^{th} July). Telling the time to the hour and half hour. Year 1 have been amazing when explaining their answers in more detail, using their sentence stems to support their learning.



In English, the children have enjoyed reading The Magic and Mystery of Trees by Jen Green. Creating fact file booklets. The children have also been exposed to rhyming poems, creating their own Dr Seuss poem. As always, the children have enjoyed role-playing showing their fantastic acting skills!

Art

In Art we have looked at Vincent Van Gogh and created our own interpretations of his famous Starry night. They look amazing!















In PSHRE we have been learning about different cultures and how they benefit us. We did some dancing and tried foods from around the world.

We have had a lovely half term in Year 3, the children have worked extremely hard and that has been shown across all areas of the curriculum.

In English we have explored the use of persuasion texts this half term. We finished the unit by writing a persuasive letter to Tesco to encourage the use of plastic bags being stopped. We then moved on to looking at Haiku poetry which we thoroughly enjoyed. The children were able to write and perform their own Haiku poems which we shared with Year 4!

In History we have been exploring the History of Buntingford! We have used the chrome books to research about historic buildings in Buntingford and historic individuals from the town. We enjoyed a walk around Buntingford identifying any of the historic buildings we recognised from our research.







We have also been creative in DT this half term. We have been researching and exploring the importance of a healthy and balanced diet. The children were then able to plan, create and consume a wrap or toastie. The children were able to use different cutting, grating and spreading techniques when making their product.












PE, Eco Warriors, Forest School and Outdoor Learning



Magic arrived in Forest School this half term with a beautiful enchanted door inviting everyone through to an imaginary place. Layston pupils enjoyed visiting the most amazing creative places and used excellent vocabulary to describe it to us on their return. Maybe some of us will be going to those places in our summer holidays?

Other magic took place when we used tools safely to create beads for bracelets out of elder twigs. Older children used a whittling knife sensibly to make themselves an elder pen.

Pond dipping gave us all the opportunity to identify creatures that live in the school pond. Lots of newts were spotted and their patterns admired, many pupils delighted in distinguishing between the males and females. We also marvelled at the damselflies above the pond. Our tadpoles grew into froglets and we decided to release them into the wild. Look out for our frogs when you cross the ford.





Talking about the process of making paper from trees... we made pulp out of tissue and water and then tried making our own piece of paper. We used wild flowers, leaves and grasses to decorate it. This was not an easy task but some beautiful paper was made.

When the week of the water fights arrived, there was great

excitement and energy beforehand and lots of fun and squeals and yells in the forest during the activity. Excellent resilience and good sportsmanship shown, not to mention spot-on aiming!





Currently the school courgettes are flourishing and the rhubarb looks ready for a third harvest!

Lots of hard work and digging and weeding in the school allotment yielded an impressive harvest including broad beans, onions and garlic. And thank you to all of our lovely families for showing up and supporting FOLS. Have a great weekend \boldsymbol{x}








We've also had non-uniform days, cake sales and sports day to enjoy too!
