Reception

Reception have been working so hard this half term! It has been a joy to see them all so engaged and focused in their adult led learning and their child initiated learning.

We finished this term by going to the Church of St. Peter to perform our Nativity. It was lovely to see the parents and the rest of the audience enjoying our singing. We certainly did. We liked our costumes too.

We have all made amazing progress in our phonics and are beginning to apply this in our reading and writing. We like sounding out new words with the help of 'Fred Talk'. We have also learnt lots of new words in our story of Stickman and wrote lots of CVC words linked to the story. We enjoyed reading about pirates and made lots of pirate maps to help us hide all the treasure.

In maths we have been working really hard at exploring numbers to 5. We can count accurately on our fingers and find the numerals on number lines. We can tell if some numbers are missing. We like making different arrangements of 5. We used five frames to represent our numbers. We enjoyed exploring shapes and went on several walks around the school to spot shapes in the environment.

The challenge was to find shapes within shapes such as windows and doors.

We have had a busy half term in year 1 and it has been lovely to see all the children engaged in their learning. Have a lovely Christmas!

In Maths, we have been learning about addition and subtraction within 10. Children are beginning to think about parts and whole exploring the cherry model. The children have also been engaged when recognising and sorting 2D and 3D shapes.





In English, our focus books have been Gruffalo Crumble by Julia Donaldson, Three Billy Goats Gruff; by Mac Barnett, The Princess and the Pea, by Rachel Isadora and Professor Goose Debunks Goldilocks by Paulette Bourgeois. The children have been writing labels, lists and captions and their own recipes.

The children had lots of fun at their Gruffalo Crumble Tea Party!

In ICT, the children have enjoyed becoming TV Chefs. They have been able to practice using the IPADS when filming their own recipes. The children were also able to write and follow their instructions when pretending to make a healthy snack. In Geography, the children have been locating where they live on an aerial photograph, recognising local features. They have been creating maps using classroom objects before drawing simple maps of the school grounds. The children have been using maps to follow simple routes around the school grounds and carry out an enquiry about how to improve their playground. Year 1 have been fascinated when learning about Amelia Earhart in History asking questions about the past. Finding answers about the past using pictures, stories & artefacts.





We have had a great half term in Year 2 and it has been lovely to see the children enjoying their learning!

In Maths, we have been looking at addition and subtraction with numbers up to 100. We have been looking at how we can use our number bonds to help us to complete these calculations.





In History, we have been learning all about the Great Fire of London. We have explored the events of the fire and looked at similarites and differences between London now and in 1666. We had a great time on our school trip to Mill Green Museum and Water Mill.








We also had lots of fun taking part in the speed stacking competition!



We have had a lovely half term in Year 3, the children have worked extremely hard and that has been shown across all areas of the curriculum.

In English, we have explored three Fable Stories. The children thoroughly enjoyed writing their own fable based on one of the three focus texts! Six children were chosen to show their final story to Mrs McMurrough, as Miss Croucher was extremely impressed with their creativity and handwriting!







In Maths, we have explored the use of column method which the children have shown great perseverance with. We have recently moved on to looking at Multiplication and Division, where a growth in confidence has been evident.

In History, we have explored the Stone Age, Bronze Age and Iron Age. This allowed us to enjoy and learn from our great trip to Celtic Harmony. The children lived a day in the life of a Stone Age hunter!









What an action packed half term we have had! All have worked so hard.



We have enjoyed learning about persuasion through The King Who Banned the Dark. We have created powerful poetry after reading the A Small Dragon. Finally, we have begun exploring information texts ready to explain how our own inventions work.

In Guided Reading we have been hooked by Kensuke's Kingdom while also enjoying our class story of There's A Boy In The Girls Bathroom.



Year 4 loved performing Olivia. They all worked tirelessly to learn lines, improve their acting and sing beautifully. It was great to see so many shine and thrive with the extra responsibility.

Year 4 loved learning about electrical circuits as part of our science topic, and had great fun drawing accurate circuit diagrams and making complete circuits safely.
