Our Geography topic this half term explores the key question: '**Would you prefer to live in a hot or cold place?**' We are learning about the continents, the poles, the equator and features of hot and cold places.



Please complete one (or more!) of the following activities:

1. Imagine you are an adventurer and have just returned from a trip. Write a recount of your journey. Where did you go? What did you see? What was the weather like? What did you have to wear?
2. Create a world treasure map. Make sure you include all the continents, poles and equator. Don't forget a compass! And an 'x' to mark the spot... Maybe you could age it with a teabag, so it looks authentic.
3. Choose a country that is either near to the equator, or near to one of the poles. Create a fact file or presentation on it. You could include: a map showing where it is in the world; what kind of physical features it has (deserts, mountains, rivers, jungle, ice fields etc.); what important human features it has (largest city, any famous landmarks etc.); what kind of weather it has; what its flag looks like; anything else you think would be interesting about it!
4. Create your own model of the globe around a craft ball or balloon. You could use green and blue paint, or tissue paper to create land and ocean - there are lots of ideas online! Use a map or globe to help you label the continents, poles and equator.

You will have a chance to share your wonderful work with the class - we can't wait to see what you create!
